## 6. **Reports**.

#### a. Board President.

Received all 7 supt. evaluation packets from other board members. Question from Mr. Knowles about superintendent's evaluation cycle relative to board election. Referred to Policy Committee.

## b. Facilities/Planning Committee.

Mr. Knowles reported on meeting with TowerPinkster March 5. One big issue to consider is bonds v. sinking fund. Hiring TP to come up with numbers relative to roof costs and options. Mr. Loew added that many districts in the area have been looking more seriously at sinking funds. Mrs. Brunner mentioned roof also, and domestic water. Mr. Franklin will send bond/sinking fund info to all board members.

## c. Superintendent/Elementary Principal.

Mr. Franklin presented written report, as well as mail call (CASBMA dinner, MVU annual report, MDE Tech Ready pledge). In regard to Tech Ready, finance committee will likely include investment in more devices in next year's prelim. budget.

#### d. Jr./Sr. High School Principal.

Mr. Huepenbecker presented his written report and took questions. Special emphasis on bus bid process. Will expect to present a bid for approval at April meeting.

#### e. Athletic Director.

Highlights from winter sports included in principal's report. No hiring approval on Coach EZ, but Jim Oswalt will be coaching boys' varsity track this year.

## f. Director of Curriculum, Assessment, and Compliance.

Mr. Dubbeld presented his written report, as well as additional handouts on participation in state assessment programs, student data privacy, FastBridge Learning (district assessment), and special education audit. All materials archived. Supt. will be recommending inclusion of FastBridge or something like it in the prelim. budget for next year.

District School Improvement Plans with Title I are now complete, and getting more specific in terms of strategies for goal implementation.
